Guidance and Recommendations

A new publication that outlines five priorities for tackling the abuse of older people during the UN Decade of Healthy Ageing [2021-2030] will be released on 15 June 2022. The publication has been developed by WHO, in collaboration with OHCHR, UNDESA, UNFPA, and UN Women with the support of INPEA.

The publication will have a formal launch at a commemoration event during the **UNECE Ministerial Conference on Ageing [15 June 2022, 13:45 – 14:00 CEST]**, which will be livestreamed on the conference website at <https://mipaa2Orome.it/>.

Key Messages

- **The abuse of older people [also known as elder abuse]** is a single or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust that causes harm or distress to an older person. The abuse of older people can occur in community [for example, at home] or institutional settings [such as nursing homes]. It takes many forms including physical, psychological, financial/material, and sexual abuse, as well as neglect.
- **The abuse of older people is widespread.** Around 1 in 6 people aged 60 years and older experiences some form of abuse in the community, annually. In institutions, the rates of abuse of older people are higher, with 2 out of 3 staff reporting they have abused an older person in the past year. The number of older people who experience abuse is predicted to increase as countries experience rapid population ageing.
- **The abuse of older people is a serious problem** that negatively impacts physical, mental, and social health. Despite this, abuse of older people has received very little attention and resources to address it.
- **The UN Decade of Healthy Ageing (2021–2030) presents an opportunity** to address the abuse of older people in a concerted, sustained, and coordinated way across diverse sectors and stakeholders.
- **There are five actions that should be prioritised during the Decade to tackle the abuse of older people:**
 - Combat ageism, as it is a major reason why the abuse of older people receives so little attention
 - Generate better and more data on what causes the abuse of older people, how common it is, and what works to reduce or prevent it
 - Develop and scale up cost-effective solutions to stop abuse of older people
 - Make an investment case that shows how addressing the issue is money well spent
 - Raise funds, as more resources are needed to tackle the issue

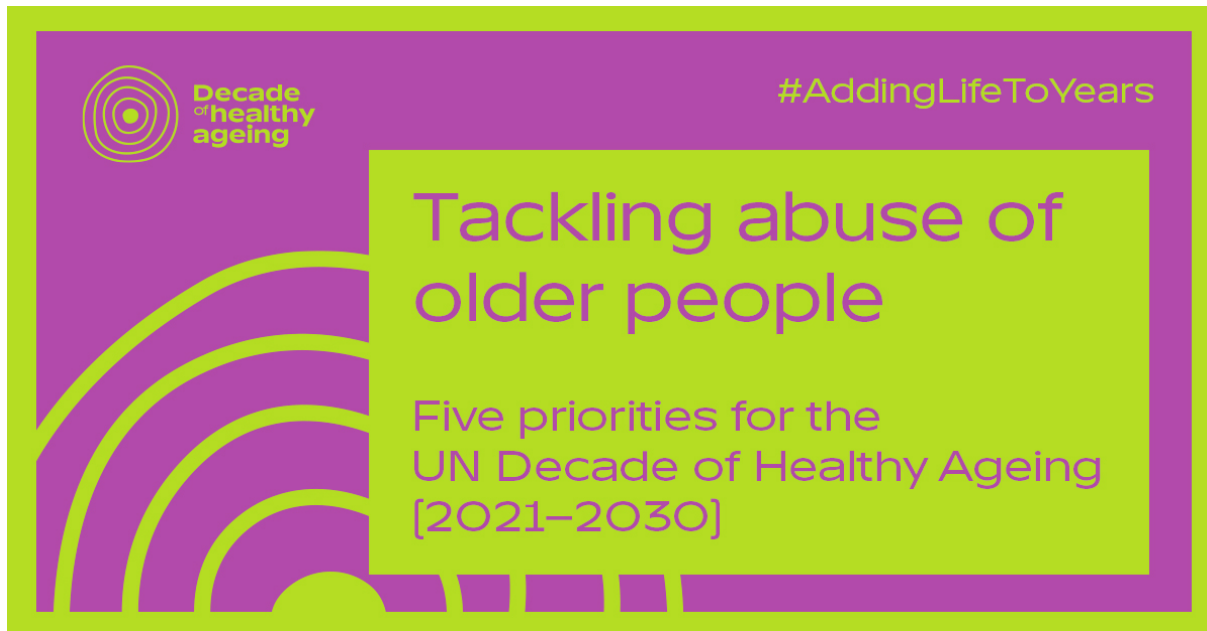
Individual tiles for each priority
